Task 4

The four-day workweek has become a major topic of discussion in many companies as it offers a range of benefits, but also comes with several drawbacks.

Proponents of this concept argue that it enhances productivity and well-being of the workforce, thus making employees more loyal to a company. This point of view is ~~strongly~~ supported by the success of multiple pilot programmes. In contrast, some experts ~~argue~~ point out that such a change has the potential to lower productivity, proves to be disruptive and have a negative impact on the spheres which require constant presence of workers.
