For two years, I carried a vocabulary notebook everywhere. I made special cards to learn phrasal verbs. My progress was painfully slow. Then I gave up on studying altogether. And something unexpected happened.

The Accident That Changed Everything

Had I continued forcing myself through grammar ~~tasks~~ tasks, I would still be stuck. One weekend I started watching an English-language reality show about cooking. Nothing educational. Just people arguing about pasta. Never before had I noticed how much casual ~~conversation~~ conversation repeats itself. The same phrases came up every episode. The contestants, having no idea they were teaching me, drilled these expressions into my head. Shows like that help us in learning idioms <sup>and</sup> phrasal verbs.

What I Learned Without Trying  
 Were I to list <sup>what</sup> this method ~~gave~~ gave me,  
 I would put natural rhythm at the top.  
 Textbooks teach you to speak slowly and  
 correctly. Shows teach you to speak like  
 a human. I also stopped translating in my  
 head. When you hear some phrases for  
 the ~~thirtieth~~ thirtieth time, the translation step  
 disappears. Moreover, watching films  
 like "Great Gatsby" or "Gone with the  
 Wind" also helps ~~in~~ in preparation as  
 the plot is similar to the book. And  
 usually people remember pictures better  
 than texts. These films ~~also~~ help you  
 in ~~the~~ cultural part of an Olympiad.

### Why This Works

Our brain is built for patterns. When  
 you give it the same pattern for many  
 times, it learns them. The repetition  
 disguised as entertainment. Of course,  
 practicing exercise for word formation,  
 grammar and reading is ~~also~~ vital but  
 phrasal verbs and idioms are asked more  
 often in English Olympiads.
